## Focus Grants Competition: *Life Skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*

The Natick Education Foundation (NEF) is an independent nonprofit volunteer organization dedicated to stimulating excellence in Natick's public schools by awarding grants for projects and purchases that support the curriculum, by funding scholarships and professional development for educators, and by raising the profile of public education in Natick.

This year the **Focus Grant Competition is directed to *Life Skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century***. NEF will make a substantial investment across the elementary, middle and high school levels in projects that supplement or enrich curriculum which teaches such skills. Today as we prepare to send our graduating seniors off into the world, our children will need the skills to manage many transitions through their lives – changing schools, jobs, careers, and geography. How our children choose to manage those changes – or not – will have an enormous impact on their future. Understanding how to control finances, address legal matters, balance competing priorities, and maintain personal safety can have an enormous impact on the health and well being of our children. As we continue to develop the “book-smarts” of our children through the standard curriculum, we hope through our grant activity to develop the “street-smarts” that will ensure our young adults enter the world as capable and savvy members of society, armed with an understanding of the benefits and risks they will face.

In addition to this major focus area, we have also allocated funds to support enrichment grants. Please see our web site [www.NatickEdFoundation.org](http://www.NatickEdFoundation.org) for instructions for this separate competition.

The NEF Educational Grants Competition will fund academic and arts enrichment programs or purchases that will bring a new and dynamic learning experience to Natick students which they would otherwise not have access to. Not only does the competition seek to provide students with enrichment programs, but it aims to spark ideas in the education community and reward teacher initiative and innovation. NEF will support projects as well as the purchase of supplies and equipment that supplement and enrich the academic and arts curriculum.

Applications deemed to have the greatest merit and the greatest enrichment impact on the targeted student population are awarded funding. Applications will be judged on the basis of merit and enrichment impact (the variety, depth, and number of enrichment opportunities the proposal will make possible) and the demonstrated need for, value of, and quality of the program or equipment. Applications will be evaluated by the NEF Grant Screening Committee, and their recommendations will be reviewed and approved by the NEF Board of Directors. Please see attached for details.

## GRANTS COMPETITION

Grants in this category will provide support of supplemental or enrichment projects or educational purchases that demonstrate

### Support Life Skills Development

NEF anticipates awarding substantial funds across the three levels of schools (elementary, middle, and high).

Support will be provided for supplemental or enrichment educational projects or purchases which focus on the Development of Life Skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Of particular interest will be projects that address skills needed to successfully manage many of the transitions through the lifespan – changing schools, jobs, careers, and geography. Instilling the self-awareness and assessment skills to effectively manage through these changes is essential in today's world. Personal safety, including rape prevention, domestic violence awareness, and substance abuse education are other topic areas that might be covered in this competition.

### Qualifying Standards

Only applications that comply with the following qualifying standards will be considered for the NEF 2009 Life Skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Initiative Grants Competition:

- The proposed project or purchase must be supplemental or enrichment. This competition is not intended for funding basic education already, or reasonably covered by the school budget. It is to fund newer, more experimental, more enriching, or more effective approaches or projects than have been done in the past, or could reasonably be expected to be supported by the school budget.
- Applications must enhance the quality of education in the Natick Public Schools. **Life Skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century** educational projects or purchases which may include, but are not

limited to, projects involving the arts which spark creativity, especially across curriculum areas and may involve performance and visual projects.

- The application must be for a supplemental or enrichment classroom project, program, or curricular unit and the material necessary to implement it or for the purchase of material or technology for general enrichment purposes. Related professional development may be supported on a limited basis. NEF seeks applications that demonstrate originality, innovativeness, and/or creativity.
- Proposed projects/purchases must be consistent with and supplement or enhance the curriculum framework of the Natick Public Schools.
- The proposed project or purchase will have a significant impact on Natick students, in both the short- and long- term.
- Successful applications will have clearly defined goal(s), will articulate the methods to be used to meet these goal(s), will identify all participants, will identify the number of students impacted, will have a justified and realistic budget, and will describe how the impact of the project or purchase will be measured.
- A proposed project must be academic or art-oriented. NEF will not support inter- or extra-mural athletics, social, counseling, or outreach programs, as valuable to education as they are. Nor will the NEF support field trips, food, or more than incidental consumable supplies.
- A proposed purchase must be necessary for achieving at least one specific enrichment goal and the plan for the use of the purchase must be included in the application. The more enrichment goals that can be met by the proposed purchase, the better.
- NEF greatly respects the value of consultants, visiting artists, artists in residence, and performers, but this competition is not primarily intended for funding them. There may be rare cases in which consultants' impact would be so great in relation to his or her compensation that an exception can be made.
- Educator(s) assigned to implement the project can be teacher, staff or administrator of the Natick Public Schools, or a parent, student, or member of the community working without financial compensation under the supervision of a primary applicant who is a teacher, staff member, or administrator.
- If Applicant is not seeking full funding for project, additional sources of funding must be secured and noted.

## Life Skills for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Process

**Please note:** Applicants may submit a **Letter of Intent** form and brief attachment by **January 16, 2009**.

The Board review preliminary applicants who will be asked to submit full proposals. By January 31, 2009, persons submitting letters of intent will have a response from NEF.

Those with successful Letters of Intent will submit ten (10) copies of the completed Grant Application Cover Sheet and attached Project Description to the Natick Education Foundation. **Applications must be received by submission to our website: [www: NatickEdFoundation.org](http://www.NatickEdFoundation.org) or postmarked by 2/13/09.**

A Grant Screening Committee reviews **applications**. Applicants may be contacted for further information about their grants, and may be asked to meet in person with the grant screening committee.

In May 2009, the Grant Screening Committee makes recommendations to the Natick Education Foundation Board of Directors. The Board makes final funding decisions.

Recipients and non-recipients are notified in May of 2009.

Funds are awarded in a lump sum payment. Checks are mailed by the end of May 2009 and must be used during the 2009-2010 school year. Funds not used by end of school, 2010, must be returned to NEF.

Winners are requested to cooperate with publicity requests.

Winners will be asked to complete a brief grant results form that evaluates the success of the project for NEF internal use and either prepare a simple poster board presentation on the grant for display at NEF events, or give NEF enough visual or written documentation so we can prepare a poster for display. Deadline for documentation is September 30, 2010.

## Judging Criteria for ALL Applications

#### **I. Basic Standards:**

- Application must comply with qualifying standards, as above.
- The proposed project's goal, objectives, and methods must be clearly stated, appropriate, and warrant the expenditure requested.
- The proposed project must be likely to achieve its goal.
- The proposed budget must be clearly justified and realistic.
- Feasible plans must exist for securing any non-NEF funds and/or conditions necessary for the project.
- NEF must be the most likely and logical funding source for project.

#### **II. Presentation:**

A well-executed presentation expresses competence and enthusiasm on the part of the applicant(s). Application should be clear and complete; goal, methods, and plan to evaluate the success and impact of the project should be logical, plausible, and well explained.

#### **III. Potential benefit:**

- How great would the benefit be to the students affected by the proposed project?
- How large is the pool of possible beneficiaries of the project? (The number of students impacted in the short and long term as well as possible benefit to other schools, teachers and the community at large.)

#### **IV. Merit:**

The NEF seeks applications with as many of the following examples of qualities as possible: originality, innovativeness, creativity, imaginativeness, and/or the extent to which proposed program enhances curriculum, programs, or services.

#### **V. Other:**

NEF seeks applications which include a feasible plan for establishing a secondary pool of beneficiaries (e.g., a plan to educate other teachers about learning made possible by purchase, and to lend or share material, as appropriate).
